**POLICY GUIDELINES**

Frequency and Utilization Limitations and Imaging Requirements

The Noridian LCD L39242 provides frequency limitations for epidural steroid injections (ESIs), as well as limitations to performing ESIs in addition to other types of block procedures.

According to this same Noridian LCD, ESIs must be performed under CT or fluoroscopy image guidance with contrast. Exceptions may be considered for patients with a documented allergy to low molecular weight nonionic contrast or patients who are pregnant. In these situations, ultrasound guidance without

contrast may be considered. ESIs performed with ultrasound guidance are not generally considered medically necessary, unless documentation supports the unique circumstances noted above or other unusual clinical situations noted in the LCD (e.g., cases of documented contraindication to contrast media, such as allergies), which may require the use of another imaging option.

ESIs performed **without** imaging guidance (CPT codes 62320, 62322) are also considered not medically necessary.
